If You Need Training


Give us a call

Changes to MJD

Alcohol and Drug Abuse Tx.

Effective May 26, 2004, the Oregon Administrative Rule governing the provision of Marijuana Education and Treatment



has been repealed. The attached letter explains this in greater detail.

As for CPMS, we ask that you cease using your Marijuana Education and Treatment Provider Number. Any new clients referred by the Alcohol/Marijuana Evaluation Specialist, (AMES), should be enrolled in your outpatient provider number.

When enrolling them into your outpatient provider number, use '00' for eligibility code.

We will close your Marijuana Education and Treatment provider number, once your last Marijuana Diversion client leaves treatment.

E-form Users

Alcohol and Drug Abuse Tx.

If you use the Alcohol and Drug Abuse CPMS Electronic Form, (E-form), please read on.

Once a week we ask that you export your CPMS forms to us. When you choose export from the main menu, it allows you to export the file to a floppy



diskette or to another local drive. After choosing the appropriate drive, and clicking OK the export

process begins. Soon you will see a messaging stating that the export process is complete. *However, it's not really complete.*

There is one more step.

We need you to **send us that file**. You can send it as an attachment to an email or simply mail the diskette to us. We prefer email.

You can then check the Monthly Management Report (MMR) to make sure we got the file. As turnover does occur in your programs, please make sure that your staff know about this final step. Please give us a call if you have any questions. Thank you for using the CPMS e-form.

Figure 1 - Admit Age




Figure 2 - Race/Ethnicity





Figure 3 - Gender

Re: Elimination of Marijuana Education and Treatment

Date: 7/12/04

Effective May 26, 2004, Oregon Administrative Rules 410-009-0000 through 410-009-0040, governing the provision of Marijuana Education and Treatment has been repealed. As a result, it is no longer necessary to refer Marijuana Diversion clients to a certified Marijuana Education and Treatment Program. Marijuana Diversion clients should be screened and referred by the AMES to an approved outpatient treatment provider if they exhibit any of the indicators listed under the referral criteria. If outpatient treatment is recommended, then the frequency of contact and the length of stay in treatment would be determined by the outpatient provider based on ASAM PPC-2R criteria. The AMES would monitor the case and report back to the courts as they would for a DUII client.

If no problem is identified at the conclusion the AMES should notify the court that the screening did not identify any indicators justifying a referral for drug abuse treatment. The information should be reported to the court as screening completed, no referral made.

As a result of this change we have revised both the Marijuana and Alcohol Diagnostic and Referral Forms, incorporating them into one form. A sample copy of the new form has been enclosed and should be available in the next few weeks. In the future you will be receiving one form that can be used for either DUII or Marijuana Diversion clients.
