Message:

On March 26, 2010, transmittal SS-AR-10-005 was sent to field staff regarding the Kaiser Child Health and Kaiser Transitions programs for children. After the IM was sent questions were raised regarding whether or not a 415H should be completed and sent to HIG for individuals who were covered by either of these Kaiser Permanente children's programs.

It has been determined that this type of insurance does not meet agency criteria as a third party payer. For that reason, staff should not send a 415H to HIG.

Note: Kaiser Child Health and Kaiser Transitions are not the same thing as DMAP's Kaiser Permanente (PCO) managed care plan. If a client is enrolled in the Kaiser PCO and has private health insurance, workers should complete the 415H and send it to HIG. This IM (and not sending a 415 to HIG) only applies to the Kaiser Child Health and Kaiser Transitions which they sponsor in partnership with the public schools.
