

## Time Limit Extensions and JOBS Statuses

JOBS exemptions and time limit extension are to be looked at separately. JOBS exemptions are based on the parent or caretaker's inability to engage in JOBS activities. Time limit extensions are based on the parent or caretaker's inability to obtain or maintain employment in excess of TANF exit income limits.

*Note: A parent providing care for their dependent child with a disability can choose to be JOBS eligible and still qualify for a time limit extension. The parent may be able to engage in activities but not able to work enough hours to exceed the TANF income limits.*
