Update:

Emergency Allotments have been approved in Oregon for the month of **October 2022** by the Food and Nutrition Service (FNS).

Message:

ODHS has been approved to issue emergency allotments for the month of

October 2022. As before, there will be three issuances in the form of overnight batches. The first batch will capture most ongoing cases. The second batch catches any new cases. A third catch-up batch will be issued in early **November**. The dates the benefits **become available** to SNAP households are listed below.

Will notices be sent to households related to these payments?

As this is a mass distribution, we will not be sending individual notices to households eligible for EA payments. A media release will be distributed, and communication will be done through social media and outreach through community partners.

Reminders:

- See transmittal [SS-AR-21-002](#) for issues related to the issuance of a SNAP supplement resulting in error: “Requested issuance amount cannot be greater than maximum monthly amount”. This happens often after the system has already issued EA for the month.
- As of April 2021, households previously receiving less than \$95 or \$0 in EA, may receive a supplement of \$95 in EA. Households eligible for \$95 or more in EA will not see a change in their EA amounts.
- As of May 11, 2021, households eligible for a \$0 SNAP regular base allotment are

no longer eligible to receive EA benefits. This is due to new federal clarification in April 2021.

- Emergency allotments are not regular SNAP. They come from COVID related funding and are approved monthly.
