

full premium for the private health insurance without FHIAP assistance; they will not be eligible for OHP Standard. Some families may choose to move to OHP Standard but leave their children on FHIAP. Others may decide to move their entire family to OHP.

When a family chooses to include their children in the move to OHP, an application must be submitted to DHS and an eligibility determination required for the children. It is only specific adults who have been federally approved to move into OHP Standard without an initial eligibility determination.

The FHIAP recipients who will have the opportunity to move to OHP will receive notification in the first week of April. The information they receive will explain the changes and give the individual the timelines they must follow if they choose to move to OHP Standard. DHS expects that most of the FHIAP adults who choose to move to OHP Standard will begin receiving medical assistance by June 1, 2008.

If a new OHP Standard recipient who transferred from FHIAP is also receiving other program benefits in branches, the case will be opened at the Statewide Processing Center and then transferred to the appropriate branch, and the worker will be notified.

Implementation/Transition Instructions: Please take the time to review the attached FHIAP notification forms. Field offices may receive calls from individuals who wish to ask about the OHP Standard program and how the change will affect them.

Clients who transfer to OHP Standard will be coded FHT. Please do not remove this coding at any time. This code will be used to track the clients who transfer from FHIAP to OHP Standard, and will provide useful data for the agency.
