The Oregon Emergency Medical Services and Trauma Systems Section is soliciting nominations from members of the public interested in serving on the State Trauma Advisory Board (STAB) as the Representative for the Public at large. The term of the appointment is four (4) years.

There is one (1) open position for a representative for the public at large. In order to accommodate appropriate statewide representation, the appointee should be a resident of Area Trauma Advisory Board (ATAB) Region 2, 3, 6 or 9, with preference being given to ATABs 3, 6 and 9, (see attached ATAB descriptions and Trauma System map).

The STAB is an advisory committee that meets four (4) times a year. The role of the committee is to both advise and serve as a resource to the Trauma Program and EMS and Trauma Systems Section. This is a working committee with subcommittees that provide insight and make recommendations for trauma care. The committee is involved in regulatory rule making, systems development and quality improvement. For this reason, members generally have knowledge and experience in Oregon EMS and Trauma Programs, and are involved in their local Trauma community. The statutory guidance for the STAB is set forth in the Oregon Revised Statutes, Chapter 431, Section 607 and are further defined in OAR 333-200-0030. (copy attached).



***Oregon Administrative Rule Excerpted:
State Trauma Advisory Board***

333-200-0030

State Trauma Advisory Board Functions

(1) The STAB shall:

- (a) Advise the Division in meeting the objectives established in OAR 333-200-0020;
- (b) Advise the Division on the adoption of rules, policies, and procedures regarding the trauma system; and
- (c) Analyze data related to prevention of injuries, monitoring of the trauma system and recommend improvements where indicated.

(2) The Division shall seek the advice of the STAB concerning the approval of area trauma system plans and approval of subsequent protocols for major modifications.
