Filter reports by entering search criteria in each column (asterisk * is a search wildcard)

Selection	Enter an S next to a report and press enter to browse.	
Report ID	Locate a specific Report ID Enter an L with the <i>reportid</i> in the Command Line. The selected report now displays first and all other reports below it.	
	Search with a partial Report ID (* = wildcard) Use the first few letters of the report followed by an asterisk to display all reports that start with those letters. Example: Entering WCM* selects only reports that start with WCM. A list of all reports that start with those 3 letters appears.	
Description	Enter the first word of the report name followed by an asterisk and press enter. A list of reports that begin with that word will appear.	
Arch Date (Archival)	Enter the desired date . A list of all reports for the date selected appears. The format is MM/DD/YYYY.	
Lines	Lists the number of lines in the report (lines are equal to records)	
Pages	List the number of pages in the report. Be sure to read this field before printing a report as some reports are very large

Tips

If you want to select a specific report, you can add criteria such as Report ID, Description, and Arch Date to limit the number of reports to display.

You can also begin to print a report by entering a P that displays the CA Deliver Reprint Attributes screen

Navigation and common commands

END (F3)	Returns to previous screen	
RETURN (F4)	Returns you to the Primary Selection screen	
DOWN (F8)	Scrolls toward the bottom of the data	
UP (F7)	Scrolls toward the top of the data	
LEFT (F10)	Scrolls toward the first column of the data	
RIGHT (F11)	Scrolls towards the last column of data	
PRT or P	Prints entire report displayed	
LOCATE – abbreviate as LOC or L	Locates a report in the selection list Note: Report Descriptions containing apostrophes (or single quotation mark) An apostrophe (or single quotation mark) in a Report Description must be entered as a pair of single quotation marks. A non-paired single quotation mark ends the ID. For example, if the value is JIM'S REPORT it must be entered as 'JIM'S REPORT'.	
MODE	If you have multiple Distribution (Dist) IDs, use this command to switch between them, such as MODE HWB1234.

SORT	Sorts the selection list and displays reports based on field name and predetermined sequence; sort up to two (2) fields, such as SORT field1 field2.
