Delirium vs. Dementia

Both Delirium and Dementia feature cognitive impairments and various psychiatric symptoms but here are some things to look for:

<u>Delirium</u>	<u>Dementia</u>
-Reversible	-Irreversible damage/loss
-Usually develops over hours or days	-Sometimes slow/insidious (degenerative illnesses such as: Alzheimer's, Parkinson's, Frontotemporal, Lewy Body)
-Symptoms of wax and wane	-Vascular (strokes or bleeds)
-Multiple medical causes	-TBI
-Previously damaged brains are more vulnerable and slower to recover	-Substance abuse (Alcohol) -Episodes of low oxygen

The simplest screening tests for cognitive impairments:

- MMSE (Mini-Mental State Examination)
- SLUMS (Saint Louis University Mental Status Examination)
- MOCA (Montreal Cognitive Assessment)
