When the disqualified person signs the agreement to close or reduce their case the household must be informed in writing when the closure or reduction will take effect, and if a reduction what the new SNAP allotment will be.  The MSC 649C does not include an effective date or allotment amount. To ensure compliance with federal regulations three OARs have been revised and a new process has been put in place.
