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

Two staff training modules focused on support for individuals with dementia and serious mental illness are now available on-line. The two modules are each about 50 minutes, and are designed for aging and behavioral health staff who work with the public or clients. Individuals who complete a brief survey and assessment at the end of the second module will receive an emailed certificate of completion.

- Module 10 Bipolar disorders, Dementia, and Delirium
- Module 11 Schizophrenia and Dementia

The two new modules build on training developed over the past 2 years for ADRC staff and partners as part of an Administration for Community Living grant focused on increasing Oregon's capacity to address the growing impact of dementia across systems.
