## CAF Domestic Violence Resource Check-out Process

The books or videos that are available have not been screened. They may be outdated or have information that does not accurately portray domestic violence as we understand it today. Please review the videos before showing to field staff in order to identify any potentially problematic pieces so they can be talked about and addressed.

It is recommended that when showing a domestic violence video a DV service provider be present.

Process:

Step 1: Call: Verona Turner

Step 2: Request specific title (book or video)

Step 3: \*Verona will send you a fax to sign

\*The check-out period is two weeks

\*Extensions can be granted if there is no waiting list for that specific

book/video

Step 4: Fax back request to Verona

Step 5: Verona will shuttle or mail you the book/video along with a sign-in

sheet for videos (122DV) and feedback forms for both videos and

books

Step 6: \*Read book or show video

\*Have people sign-in when watching a video (122DV)

\*Complete feedback form for book/video

Step 7: Return book/video; sign-in sheet and feedback forms to Verona
